To keep residents informed about Oceanfront event-related logistics, public safety planning and communications, City staff shared information about Oceanfront events at a community meeting on March 28. The first meeting covered events through July 4 with anticipated attendance of more than 10,000 per day (subject to change), and another meeting will be held to cover events through the end of the year.

The City's goal for the 2024 event season is the same as it has always been — to enable residents and visitors to enjoy their time in the city, while ensuring the City is fully prepared to address issues such as traffic, crowds, safety and public communication.
